

Xylitol is deadly to dogs.

What is xylitol?

It's commonly used as a sugar substitute and can be found in gum, candy, and even some types of peanut butter.

Xylitol is **100x** more toxic to dogs than chocolate.

2

pieces of gum can cause low blood sugar.



10

pieces can lead to liver failure.



What are the symptoms?

Symptoms may appear within 10-60 minutes of consumption and include:

- Vomiting
- Weakness or fatigue
- Tremors
- Walking "drunk" or uncoordinated
- Seizures

How do you treat xylitol toxicity?

Immediate treatment is crucial.

- Call or get to your local emergency vet clinic ASAP
- Do not induce vomiting unless advised, as vomiting can worsen low blood sugar
- Veterinary treatment may include IV fluids and stabilizing medications
